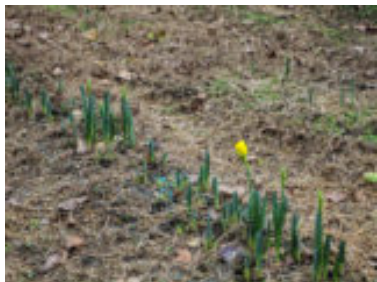
Cormiston , an Irwin selection is strong at the moment .
