

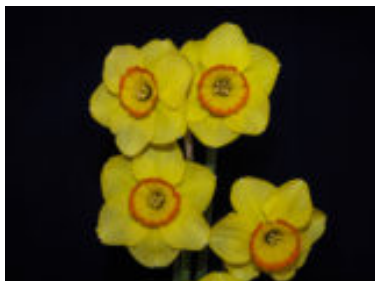
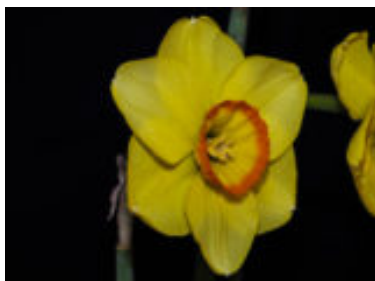
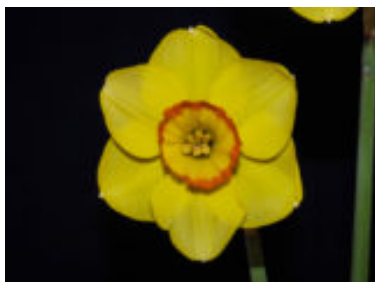
Late Flowers - October 2016

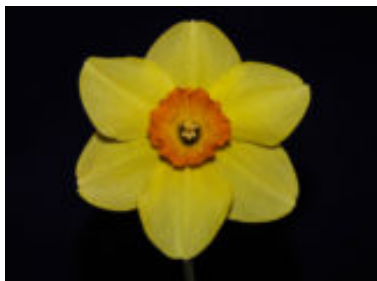

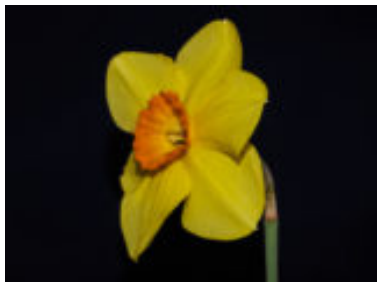

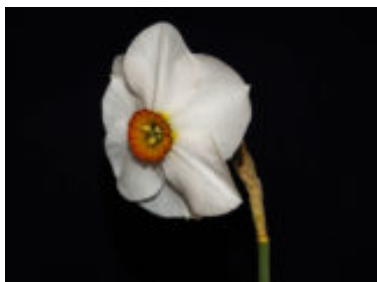

FLASH IN THE PAN - 3Y - O -- Reg Cull --- A useful late from Reg , tall stemmed and attractive softer colours .



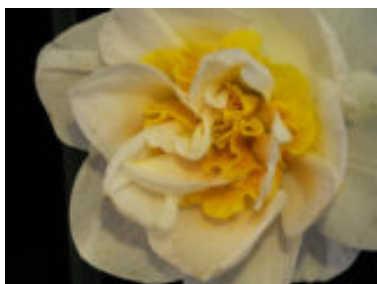

Both first flowers with fair form .Interesting petaloid colours , just a little lighter than T G but also showing the lighter colour on the outer edge . Both parents have strong stems and so do these .One excellent neck and one O K neck . Definitely worth pegging .
